Her mother was a science teacher who instilled in her a love and deep curiosity about the natural world. Katelyn knew what she wanted to study at Hood--after all, it was partly the coastal studies minor that drew her here, along with the then-new Hodson Science and Technology Center. But it wasn't until she was truly out in the field with her professors that she saw some "career opportunities that I hadn't considered." Today she's the only woman in the state of Maryland to hold the position of land manager for the Maryland Department of Natural Resources Wildlife and Heritage Services, enhancing and protecting state lands for native species.
