NURSING

As a nursing student at Hood, you will have access to our state-of-the-art facilities, including numerous simulation labs equipped with high-fidelity equipment and technology used in real-world nursing practice.

The hospital-style rooms can be converted into intensive care, pediatric, obstetric and patient-centered care rooms. Simulation scenarios and debriefing sessions are used to teach you the latest evidence-based practice, while developing your clinical reasoning and judgment skills.

Learning through simulation is aimed at providing realistic patient care scenarios. These can be recorded for viewing later, as you reflect on the clinical decision-making used during care. Simulation is an essential part of nursing education, where students can apply their knowledge without fear of harming a real patient.

Our objective is to provide you with a high-quality educational experience that increases your professional aptitude, broadens your choices for career advancement and improves the quality of nursing both locally and regionally.

WHY GET YOUR BSN?

- Higher earnings—a BSN can set you up for increased wages in your career, with a median salary of more than \$80,000.
- Employment rates—the American Association o f Colleges of Nursing (AACN) reports that 94% of BSN holders found employment within four to six months of graduation. More than 40% of hospitals and healthcare facilities require a BSN for employment.



- Diverse settings—a BSN can take you to a variety
 of healthcare settings, including hospitals, outpatient
 care, community clinics and home health services.
- Career advancement—with a BSN, you can apply for leadership or specialty roles, such as case manager or quality assurance coordinator. You will also become eligible to pursue graduate-level nursing studies.
- Improved patient outcomes—having a comprehensive nursing education and greater autonomy has been shown to significantly improve the quality of patient care under BSN-prepared nurses.

PUBLIC HEALTH

The public health major encompasses science, math, social and behavioral sciences, psychology, biology, health, communication, sociology and social work. This highly interdisciplinary program epitomizes Hood's mission of providing students a comprehensive liberal arts education integrated with professional development.

As part of the public health core curriculum, you will complete a year-long, applied service-learning internship based on your unique interests, which may use elective credits to pursue a related course of study (minor or certificate). This well-rounded educational experience will prepare you for entry-level professions in government, nonprofits, education, advocacy and research.
