SOCIOLOGY

You will work closely with a faculty member to complete an independent research project and/or engage in community-based research with the City of Frederick Department of Housing and Human Services as part of the senior capstone. Most students also complete an internship experience (up to 15 credits) guided by a site supervisor and faculty mentor.

You will utilize grant writing, program evaluation, research, communication and data collection/analysis skills on a project with one of our community partners. Popular internship sites include United Way of Frederick County, YMCA, Frederick County Healthcare Coalition and Frederick County Sheriff's Office.

SOCIAL WORK

Our curriculum includes courses in practice methods, research, policy and theory—all the necessary skills to become a generalist social worker. Small class sizes allow for individualized attention, while hands-on experience in the form of service learning and simulated practice will prepare you for a dynamic career in social work.

As a senior, your classroom learning will culminate in a 500-hour field practicum supervised by a licensed social worker. Practicum sites include Frederick County Public Schools, Carroll Lutheran Village, Family Partnership, Office of the Public Defender and the Mental Health Association.



BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

As a student in the Department of Sociology and Social Work, you will take part in internships or field placements, which will serve as community-based educational opportunities that connect classroom learning and career aspirations with real-world experience. This combination of academic and practical knowledge will prepare you to pursue graduate school or a career. Students may also work with a faculty member on an independent study related to a specialized topic of your own choosing.

4PLUS

Hood's 4PLUS program combines undergraduate and graduate studies to save you time and money. By working with your adviser, you can start taking courses toward your master's in your junior or senior year and earn dual-course credit for both your bachelor's and master's degree.

Any major can work toward a master's in business administration, cybersecurity or information technology.
