
SUPPORT

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The program is highly selective, and space is limited. Applicants are thoroughly reviewed. Basic requirements for first-year applicants include:

- Strong written communication skills.
- Minimum 3.5 GPA.
- AP, IB or dual-enrollment courses (if offered).
- College preparatory high school curriculum (if offered).

Requirements for transfer students include:

- Strong written communication skills.
- Minimum 3.5 GPA (from previous institution).
 Prior participation in an honors program (if offered).

Honors priority application deadline is January 15. Applications received after the priority deadline are considered if space is available.
